
Walk to Emmaus

It is a new year, and grace abounds! I did not start the year with any New Year's resolutions because I know I rarely keep them. However, I did identify a few things I would like to work on. These are things I enjoy and bring me a reasonable amount of peace.




Announcing: Virtual Regional Gatherings!!

WE DID IT!

In 2018, when we decided to not have Fall Weekends, we embarked on Community Wide "big" events, held each Fall. The first was our **Luke 24** event, where we came together to empower Church Leaders. Then came **Faith in Action: Feeding the 10,000**. Together, with Rise Against Hunger, we raised money, raised Spirits, and raised awareness as we gathered at Carter UMC to pack 10,000 meals for distribution to those in greatest need world-wide. In October 2020, with the Pandemic in full force, we held a virtual fundraiser, **Faith in Action: Feeding our Community**. We partnered with Feeding America and raised

over \$6,500 to serve food insecurity needs in the US, as well as \$1,500 in pledges to support local food banks! Thanks to all who helped organize, donated, or participated in this fantastic display
